During our Sunday AM worship, we will finish up our study of the gospel of Mark while presenting the usual topical holiday sermons (Mothers' Day, Memorial Day, Fathers' Day, etc.). In October there will be some lessons to prepare us for Stepping Stone Sunday. Also, Ray will be presenting messages from God's word from time to time, when they are not traveling to see their other grandkids.

For our Sunday afternoon service, we can look forward to a series I have entitled: Wisdom For The Week. It is a study through the Old Testament books of wisdom literature: Job, Psalms, Proverbs, Ecclesiastes, and Song of Solomon. These lessons will be designed to give us little nuggets of wisdom from God's word to help us through the week. It will not be an exhausted study of these books. The series will probably last six months IF we are back to our normal schedule by June.

On Wednesday nights, along with SONGS, and devotionals from the men, we will begin a study I call: God's Relationship With Humanity. As the title indicates, this is a study of God's relationship with not only His people, but with the whole world. We will be examining passages from Genesis to Revelation which focus on God's unique interactions with humanity. Though this will not be an extensive study of the 66 books of the Bible, it will take at least six months to complete.

One last item: 5th Sunday Pulpit Swaps. I haven't talk to Chuck Marshall about continuing this arrangement. I want to wait until we are back to our normal routine before making any plans.

I sure am looking forward to getting back to normal, especially in regard to preaching and teaching. And did I mention I can't wait until we can SING again?
