## Advertise the Truth

The Church Jesus gathers out of the ungodly, dark world of sin must be a people whose way of life demonstrates the truth of the gospel. That is what Paul means when he writes of “how one ought to behave in the household of God, which is the church of the living God, a pillar and buttress of the truth.”<sup>16</sup> Great indeed, we confess, is the mystery of godliness,” (1 Tim 3:15-16).

A “mystery” in this sense is one that has been *revealed*. Paul might have been thinking of the hundreds of pagan temples he had seen in the cities he visited. They typically included carvings on their front face just under the roof line. These carvings displayed the most important story identifying the “god” to whom the temple was dedicated. These stories were literally held up for public view by pillars and architectural sup-
